SCHOOL COMMUNICATION

We encourage open and regular communication. Important information and updates will be emailed to you weekly from the school and each month you will receive an email with key dates to be aware of. These dates will also be posted on our school website. Please ensure that you are registered to receive our emails by checking in with our secretary, Mrs. Armstrong. Please use the agenda to contact your child's teacher and/or phone the school to make an appointment. Also, many teachers use the Google Classroom to communicate with students AND parents. Your child's teacher will provide information about the Google Classroom this month. A package of information, including essential school consent forms and medical/allergy forms that must be filled out, will be sent home the first week of school. Please look for the package in your child's backpack and return any forms to the school as soon as possible. Thank you.

SCHOOL DRESS CODE

Solid Colours Only: Black, Navy Blue, White, Red *No patterns, No logos

Acceptable Bottoms:

- Pants or Capris
- Track pants
- Yoga pants
- Leggings/Stockings (under a skirt or dress)
- Skort, Skirt, long shorts

*All bottoms must fall below the child's fingers when standing upright with arms and fingers fully extended beside legs

Acceptable Tops:

- T-shirt
- Golf/tennis shirt
- Polo shirt
- Turtleneck
- Sweatshirt/Hoodie
- School Spirit Wear
- No midriff/"belly tops", no spaghetti strap tops

COVID-19 UPDATES

Wearing masks at school is optional. The school and child-care screening tool was updated on August 31, 2022. Staff and students should continue to screen before going into school or work every day. Key highlights include:

- If you or your child are in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, self-monitor for symptoms. There is no longer a need to isolate, but you should wear a mask for 10 days when in public (including school and/or childcare)
- If you or your child are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 such as fever, cough, or runny nose, stay home from school/work/social events until the fever is gone and symptoms are improving for 24 hours. Get a rapid antigen test/PCR test. Wear a mask for 10 days after and avoid non-essential visits to high-risk individuals and settings

SAFE SCHOOLS PROTOCOLS

It is the policy of the YCDSB to provide a preventative approach to student behavior management, progressive discipline and school safety. Please report any instances of bullying to your child's teacher or the principal, so that issues can be quickly resolved and restorative practices can be implemented. Students are not permitted to leave the school premises without written permission from parents. Students must always be signed out by a parent/guardian. Only bus students are allowed on the school bus; friends of bus students are not allowed to go on the bus. Students and staff will be reviewing the school's safety protocols and procedures and engaging in some drills the month of September.

SUPERVISION

Morning supervision begins at 8:45 a.m. Please DO NOT drop your child off prior to this time. **Student supervision ends at 3:30 p.m.** While we understand that emergencies happen, your child should be consistently picked up from school by 3:30 p.m. **Office hours are from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.** Thank you for helping us to keep your child safe.

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP

Please DO NOT park in the driveway; this is a fire route and must be kept clear at all times for Emergency vehicles/school buses. Please note that vehicles are NOT allowed to drive through the driveway when the buses are present. Please speak to your child's teacher, if you have questions about dismissal routines.

PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Students are expected to keep all personal electronic devices in their backpacks. We do not want students distracted during their instructional periods, nor do we want them using these devices inappropriately. The YCDSB assumes no responsibility for the loss, repair, or replacement of any personal electronic device brought onto school property. The only exception will apply to grade 5-8 students who have signed "Bring Your Own Device" consent forms for educational purposes set out by the classroom teachers. The grade 5-8 teachers will determine how these devices can be used during class time. Please contact your child's teacher for more information.

VISITORS/VOLUNTEERS AT SCHOOL

All visitors to the school must report to the office upon entry to the building. You will be required to sign-in at the office. If you are volunteering at the school, the secretary will give you a visitor's lanyard to wear while you on the premises. All volunteers must have criminal checks prior to volunteering at the school (must be updated every 3 years). An annual declaration that you have no criminal offences must also be completed (provided by school). If you wish to see your child's teacher, please ensure that you have set up an appointment with him or her in advance. Students must be signed out by a parent/guardian at the office, if they have to leave the school.

LUNCH DROP-OFF

We require that you follow these instructions to keep our students safe and to minimize classroom disruptions, when dropping of lunches:

- Label the lunch bag with your child's name and teacher's name
- Drop the lunch off on the lunch table in the front foyer preferably by 11:45 a.m.
- The main foyer is to remain clear at all times for safety reasons, so please do not linger
- Please inform your child in the morning that you will be dropping lunch off or let the office know
- Students may come down to pick up their lunches after the bell rings at noon

LUNCH PROGRAM/ALLERGIES:

While we recognize the significance of birthdays; we ask that edible treats NOT be sent in for sharing due to students who suffer from life-threatening allergies. MEDICATION

All students requiring prescription or non-prescription medication to be administered at school, must have their parents/guardians complete a special form and submit it to the office. All medication will be administered in the office and a medication log will be kept for each student requiring medication. Students who suffer from Anaphylactic allergies are asked to provide the school with 2 Epi-Pens: one will stay on the child at all times (in a fanny pack, preferably) and the second one will be kept in the office in case of emergency. Students who suffer from Asthma are also asked to provide the school with two puffers. Your child's safety is our number one priority.

HEAD LICE

Please routinely check your child's head for live lice and/or nits (eggs). If you find head lice, please inform the office immediately. You are encouraged to use a safe/recognized treatment to kill the lice and remove all the nits from your child's hair before your child returns to school.

LIBRARY NEWS

All students are encouraged to borrow books from the library. It is the student's responsibility to take care of the books and to make sure they are in good condition when returned. If books are lost/damaged, you will be required to replace them at a cost to you. Stay tuned for information on our upcoming Book Fair!
